Knowledge Organiser- Season and Weather-Science - Year 1

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Spring	The season, after winter, when the temperature begins to rise, plants begin to grow and animals come out from hibernation
Summer	The warmest season, coming after spring, when the days are long because the sun rises earlier and sets later
Autumn	The season, after summer, where the days get shorter, crops can be harvested and the leaves begin to fall from the trees
Winter	The coolest season, trees are often bare and some animals hibernate
Rain gauge	A tool used to measure how much rain has fallen
Thermometer	A tool used to measure the temperature
Weather Vane	A tool used to find out in which direction the wind is blowing
Data	A collection of facts, often numbers, that can give us information
Clouds	A cloud is a collection of tiny droplets of water in the sky, when the droplets fall they become rain
Hurricane	A powerful storm with strong winds

Union	The work 'union' means joined together
Kingdom	A country, state or territory ruled by a king or queen
Mountain	A landform (made of rocks and earth) that rises up high. It is higher and steeper than a hill.
Peak	The pointed top of a mountain
Summit	The highest point of a hill or mountain
Valley	A low area of land between hills or mountains, typically with a river or stream flowing through it
Gaelic	A Celtic language spoken mainly in the highland of western Scotland brought over from Ireland in the 5 th and 6 th centuries AD
City	A large town
Countryside	The land and scenery of a rural area
Northern Ireland	Country that is part of the United Kingdom
Republic of Ireland	Became an independent country in 1921 and is not part of the United Kingdom
Weather Station	A weather station is an instrument used to study the weather and climate.

Nutrition	Things in food that the body needs to remain healthy.

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Object	A thing that has a shape and can be seen or touched. Can be given a property.
Label	A term that is used to describe an object.
Group	A collection of objects.
Search	To look in order to find something.
Image	A picture of a person or thing.
Property	A word that describes an object – can be used to label objects to help in grouping.
Sort	To put objects into groups.
Colour	Examples of colours are: red, blue, yellow, green etc.
Size	How big or small an object is.
Shape	The appearance of an object, such as square, circle, triangle.

To count objects both in groups and out of groups.

To answer questions about a group of objects.

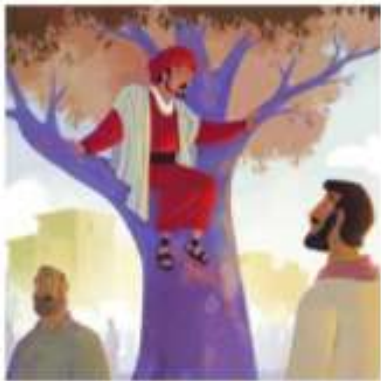
