Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing this on the day of our Easter Bonnet Parade. After the difficulties of the last two years, it brings such joy to our pupils and staff to be able to meet parents and visitors to show their bonnets! Our PTA hosted events this week and have done a fabulous job. Events raised over £360!

This term we have celebrated success in many ways. Our Y1 dancing achievements shone through at the Corn Exchange Dance event. We have had visits from Rev Wilson, the RNLI and the police this term to help pupils learn. Sharing our learning with you all during the Showcase events was fantastic too. If you want extra advice or books to read at home then please ask your child's teacher. Research shows that children who read each day go on to enjoy and attain more at school.

We continue to deliver our knowledge rich curriculum across year groups and provide enrichment activities and clubs after school to make sure every pupil can enjoy these opportunities. If you want your child to experience one of our clubs or special events but haven't yet been able to manage this then please do get in touch. It's important to give every child chances to shine. You can also reach Teresa or Alison (SEND and Pastoral Team) via the office for any advice or support to help you and your child. Just get in touch and we will get back to you!

Finally, the DFE has produced new guidance for schools on attendance- we will trial this system during the summer term to support and inform you. We may also ask you to meet with us to discuss fast tracking to boost time spent in school. These strategies all aim to help children and families. It's great to work together.

Our Learning












Goldfinches have learnt all about travel and transport this half term and created a wonderful hot air balloon area with a ticket booth. The class have met local police officers and crew from RNLI Hunstanton lifeboat Station. Both shared information about their jobs and how to stay safe. Following these visits, the children have investigated floating & sinking linked to boats. The class has also learnt the enormous turnip story and created their own versions, and also enjoyed visiting our new library with lots of wonderful new books on display. In Maths, the class has looked at numbers bonds to 10. Goldfinches have spent lots of time in the garden and have been exploring the new wildlife area.







Nursery has had a busy, happy half term here in the preschool. They have been thinking about journeys and interesting places. The children are always fascinated about animals here so lots of their play involves jungle animals. The class have told stories, made beautiful pictures and patterns and even did jungle yoga!

The children also had the chance to meet two of our local police officers who spoke about their roles in the community, what the police do and what their gear is used for.

The class has spent lots of time playing outside in the mud kitchen and preparing to plants some saplings in our garden area.









Robins have been looking at architecture in DT this term and have even visited the Heacham Parish Church to look at the building's features, have a go at drawing them and even did some wax rubbings. They've even built their own building designs out of lego. The class have loved learning about how to take care of the world in Science and have talked about the effects our actions have and what we can do to help the Earth and it's animals, including humans. In History, Robins have been getting to know the monarchs from the past, particularly Charles I, but they have really enjoyed singing along to Horrible histories' song Charles II. They have learnt about parliament and the changes brought about by Lord Protector Oliver Cromwell.

Owls have been exploring shape and fractions in Maths this term. They have loved making shapes using sticks and sweets and sharing out teddies and toys to find fractions of amounts. Science has been focused on states of matter. The children have learned how atoms are the smallest particles on earth that build up everything and even make up our own molecules. They have also been investigating what happens when chocolate is heated and it turns from a solid into a liquid. They have enjoyed writing instructions inspired by 'The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark' in English. In Art, Owls have been exploring 'Still Life' and have drawn flowers and objects inspired by Georgia O'Keefe and Giorgio Morandi. The class have been learning about the Romans in History, learning about the different parts of their armour, how their towns were built and Boudicca's revolt. They loved discovering that they would have been in the Iceni if they had lived 2,000 years ago!









All the classes had a fantastic time taking part in the Come and Sing Celebration Day event. Children learnt some fun, new songs, listened to some fabulous ukulele playing and participated in learning dances used in celebrations and festivals. They all had an amazing day! A very big thank you to Ellie and Laura for giving us a magical day! Our Year 1 class also had a fantastic time at the SSP Dance festival. After weeks of practising they performed at the corn exchange and did brilliantly! Well done!









Next Term

Sparrows will be learning about minibeasts! Why does a ladybird have spots? How does a caterpillar turn into a butterfly? Nursery will spend most of their time outside, providing the sunshine stays!

Goldfinches will also be learning about growing linked to plants and animals and developing their new growing raised bed (any veg seeds gratefully received!) They will also learn the little Red Hen story map, write their own sentences and stories, discover shapes and patterns and practice addition and subtraction facts up to 10.

Robins will look at continents in Geography, different types of plants and trees and how they grow in Science and free standing structures in Art .

Owls will be learning about the Romans in History, how they invaded and built and empire. In Science, the class will look at states of matter and materials and will focus on still life in Art!

All classes will be looking into trips this term. These will be confirmed at a later date.

Ingredients
200g milk chocolate, broken into
pieces
85g shredded wheat, crushed
2 x 1bags mini chocolate eggs
cupcake case

Melt the chocolate in a small bowl placed over a pan of barely simmering

water. Pour the chocolate over the shredded wheat and stir well to combine.

STEP 2
Spoon the chocolate wheat into 12
cupcake cases and press the back of a
teaspoon in the centre to create a nest
shape. Place 3 mini chocolate eggs on
top of each nest. Chill the nests in the
fridge for 2 hrs until set.



FSM Voucher Reminder

A message from the NCC:

To support children and families at the height of the Covid pandemic, the government provided additional funding to local authorities, first through the Covid Winter Grant and later via the Household Support Fund (HSF).

In Norfolk, this was primarily used to fund free school meal vouchers, for eligible children, during the school holidays. The fund was a one-off grant to bridge the gap between the end of furlough and the Universal Credit top-up and to give extra support to those facing significant hardship, as the economy began to recover from the pandemic.

That funding has now come to an end, meaning that free school meal vouchers will not be provided over the upcoming two-week break. The NCC recognise that the cost of living is increasing and some families may continue to need extra support over the Easter break.

The government is continuing to fund the Holiday Activities and Food programme, known locally as <u>Big Norfolk Holiday Fun</u>, for at least the next two years. This scheme includes a range of free fun activities, as well as a free lunch. Places are provided on a first come, first served basis but there are still spaces available. There is a fuller update on this programme here.

Additionally, the <u>Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS)</u> is available to support eligible families, by providing financial advice and food vouchers. Families can also search for local support for food and finances, via the <u>Community Directory</u>.

The NCC would always encourage any parents who might need extra help to contact them on 0344 800 8020, so that they can help ensure families are getting the support that they need.

Covid-19 Updates

The school continues to follow the guidelines laid out by Public Health England for schools. The Government currently advises to self-isolate (stay at home) for 10 days if you have a positive LFD result. You may be able to end isolation if you have a negative LFD on the 5th and 6th day of your isolation. This information will be updated on Friday 1st April 2022.
