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The Nest and Sparrows

Nursery children have settled in well this term. It's been lovely to welcome new friends, discover their interests and see relationships developing.

Last half term, the children learnt all about themselves and talked about important people in their lives and who they love. We talked about families and emotions.

We had two wonderful creature visits! Tortoise, Shelly and barn owls, Willow and Midnight came into Nursery and we learnt lots about them.









Goldfinches

Goldfinches spent time together looking at homes last term. They talked about different types of houses, made their own models and went for a walk around the village to identify bungalows, cottages, flats and houses.

They also thought about themselves and their families. The children looked at different parts of their bodies

and learnt about feelings. The class talked about how to stay healthy and which foods are heathy choices. They also looked at who makes up their families and how families can be different.

The children have all picked up on Phonics very quickly and are doing really well at practicing

their sounds. Do remember to have a go with your children at home and access the videos on Dojo.





Robins

Robins learnt about the human body last half term. They can name lots of different parts of the body and have learnt specifically about eyes and sight, ears and hearing.

This lead the class to look at the other 5 senses. The children played a guessing game using their 5 senses to touch, taste and smell different resources, this was really fun!

The class have really liked learning about Maps in Geography and can draw aerial maps with a key.

They enjoyed using the laptops in Computing to learn how to use the keyboard, mouse and how to be safe online.

The children also created wonderful sea pictures in Art using their knowledge of colour and shades.

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Owls have made a fantastic start to the new academic year and settled into Year 2, learning like superstars!

In English the children learnt how to write a Journey story, thinking about a character going on an exciting journey and then something unusual happens!

The children have looked at numbers to 100 and practicing their mental maths and fluency.

In Science last half term, the children learnt all about animals, living things and their habitats.

The class enjoyed a trip to Pensthorpe and they were able to explore animals and their habitats first hand.

They have looked at colour, shape and texture in Art and have created some beautiful artworks, and have also

In Geography the children have explored maps and globes.

The children have worked extremely hard and are already enjoying another new half term of fantastic learning.

This Half Term

Sparrows are now learning about night time and bedtime routines, who works during the night and space!

Goldfinches are looking at Diwali and celebrations, how they are celebrated and what the mean in different cultures. They have heard the story of Guy Fawkes and are also finding out about the seasons and weather, day and night.

Robins have started learning about what the past means to them, family trees and history in the local area. In Art, the children have experimented with line, colour and drawing – the artist they are focusing on is William Hogarth. Science sees the class learning about animals and their needs.

Owls have started to explore the food chain and predators. In History, they are visiting the Stone Age, and in DT the class will look at various mechanisms such as sliders and pivots.

The Importance of Good Attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance.

Every day away from school is a day away from learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and

help find solutions.

Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage your child to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days

that your child has been absent in a term/year.

The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.
