Goldfinches have been learning about Kings, Queens and Country this half term. The children have talked about Queen Elizabeth and King Charles, and have discussed the coronation. Helen from Music + Movement created a wonderful dance workshop showing the class how to move like royalty! They loved walking on tippy toes with their crowns on!

The class have also explored London - taking a tour virtually and looking at landmarks in the city. They've made some fabulous junk sculptures such as Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament and created some beautiful paintings too.

Goldfinches have been working really hard on their reading, writing and counting. Well done everyone!





## **Robins**

**Robins** have loved learning about being healthy and making different meals in Food Technology. They have made fruit kebabs and tried different fruits, and sandwiches too, some with some unusual fillings!

The whole class enjoyed a trip to Eric's Pizza in Drove Orchards to learn how to make their own pizzas! They learnt all about the dough used and used delicious toppings for their special lunch.

In Science the children have been learning about the weather. The class made a rain gauge and predicted how much it would rain throughout the week.

Robins have really enjoyed learning all about the United Kingdom - exploring the capital cities, visiting Scotland and finding out about the Loch Ness Monster!

**Owls** have been learning how to write a recount letter, using the story Superworm in English. They have had great fun thinking about their own superpowers!

The class have been learning all about multiplication and division and measuring too in Maths.

Science has seen Owls class learning all about the human body. Did you know we have over 200 bones in our body? They had great fun investigating the digestive system!

In art everyone has been learning about portraits and self portraits. The children have learnt how to plan a portrait, add detail and expression.

And in Geography the class have been learning all about the British Isles and finding out all about the four countries that make up the UK.





The children continue to work extremely hard and are making great progress, well done! Wishing you a restful half term and we look forward to welcoming you back after the holidays.

## **Next Half Term**

**Sparrows** will be thinking about transport and imagining travelling to other places, maybe somewhere exotic and warm!

Goldfinches will look at the topic of air, land and sea. They will discover the differences between places and talk about travel and transport. The class will also look at people that help us, such as the RNLI. They will continue to blend and read, practising their Set 1 phonics and continuing with Set 2 phonics.

**Robins** will be learning about Kings and Queens in History. Science looks at how to take care of the world including reducing, reusing and recycling. Art and Design will explore Architecture and the children will design their own building!

Owls will listen to instructions English and try to write their own. Maths will focus on capacity and statistics and in Science the class will look at matter and materials. The class will have a go at still life in Art and will learn about the Romans in History.

### Local Events and Activities

King's Lynn Fairground Mart, 11 to 19 February -The Tuesday Market Place in King's Lynn, one of the country's grandest squares, tranforms into a funfair. The Mart is a tribute to the remarkable work of Frederick Savage, who worked with the Showmen's Guild to develop new fairground rides. To save money, plan to go on 13 February when it is Children's Day and all rides (except for the Booster, dodgems and cars) are reduced to £1.

Teddy Bear Express, Bure Valley Railway, 12 to 20 February - Children go free on this bear themed event, which will see the Whistlestop Café decorated and serving up teddy bear lunch boxes (not included in ticket price). Have lots of fun on the 45-minute journey each way from Wroxham to Aylsham. Don't forget to bring your teddy! Children go free with each full fare paying adult (£16 adults, maximum two children 0-15 per adult).

Love Birds, Holkham Hall, 12 to 20 February -There's lots of events taking place including bird spotting and workshops. Enjoy walking the free trails around the grounds and sign up for a Build a Bird Box Workshop, where children can join a wildlife expert; and take the bird box home to decorate (£9 per child). There's also an Avian Art Workshop where children can create a bird themed masterpiece (£6 per child). And don't forget that Holkham Hall is perfect for a family walk or cycle too. Take in the gorgeous grounds and maybe even spot some deer! Bikes available to hire from £10.

Broad Tours Pirate Themed River Trip, Wroxham, 14 to 18 February - Pirates have commandeered the Cordon Rouge on the Norfolk Broads to seek lost treasure! They need a crew (you!) to help them find it. With pirate-themed decoration, activity packs and commentary from Flint, the pirate ship captain, it's sure to be a fun experience. Feel free to dress up in your best pirate outfit too! Trips last for 1.5 hours and run twice daily during half-term. Tickets £12.50 for adults and children.

## Read, Write Inc Phonics



Read Write Inc. is the phonics scheme used by our school. Like all phonics schemes, it teaches children the sounds in English, the letters that represent them, and how to form the letters when writing.

Read Write Inc. Phonics includes reading books written using only the letters they have learnt at each level (and a small number of separately taught tricky words). The children will quickly feel confident and successful.
