Knowledge - lifecycles and growing plants and the importance of trees in our environment. We've loved watching the caterpillars and tadpoles change.

We also enjoyed an exciting trip to Wild Kenhill.

This half term Robins have enjoyed learning about Shabbat in RE. They have remembered lots of facts relating to this!

We have learnt a song about the seven Continents in Geography and can identify these on a map.

We have been learning about the needs of plants in Science, including seed dispersal and germination.

In Design and Technology we have been looking at free standing structures, in particular bridges and skyscrapers. We learnt about The Burj Khalifa in Dubai and The Shard in London.

Some of our children have taken part in the KS1 Active Kids Festival at Lynnsport and we enjoyed a wonderful Floral Workshop lead by Hunstanton Florist. Thank you to the PTA for helping to fund this experience.

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Owls have had another fantastic half term, with lots of amazing learning! In English the children have been learning how to write an information text. They have learnt about the famous olympian Ibtihaj Muhammad! In maths we have been looking at addition and subtraction and how to add and subtract 2 two digit numbers. In Science we have been learning about electricity. We have learnt how to be safe when using electricity and even made our own electrical circuits. In Art we have been learning about murals and tapestries. We have had great fun designing and making our own ocean mural, we even had a go at weaving too. It was great fun! In Geography we have been learning all about the countries in Northern Europe. The children have also enjoyed swimming this half term. They have all made fantastic progress and I am very proud!

The importance of good attendance

The Government strives for every pupil to achieve 97% attendance. Every day away from school is a day away from

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learning and this can have an impact on a child's education and future accomplishments.

We want every child to enjoy school and achieve their potential in education and life beyond. We are always here to talk through any issues and help find solutions. Parents are always a phone call away if a child is too ill to continue their day, please encourage them to try to give the day a go, children often feel much better once they are in class.

The Government has issued new attendance guidance and targets to all schools, you may receive regular texts informing you of the number of days that your child has been absent in a term/year. The Government hope that this personal approach will make parents more aware of how the odd day adds up and help keep you informed.
